During the Victorian era there was a surge of interest in gardening, horticulture, and the discovery of new plant species. The most famous of flower shows that have endured are the [Royal Horticultural Society Flower Show](#) in Chelsea, London, and the [Philadelphia Flower Show](#). Both feature stunning floral designs and garden vignettes created by professional designers from all over the world.

A garden design educational exhibit will feature gardens both public and private in Jacksonville.

Garden club volunteers will be on site to guide the public and answer their questions.
